Banking regulators in Texas are determined to curb ACH and Wire fraud and their efforts can help everyone. With the help of the Secret Service, the Texas Bankers Association, the Independent Bankers Association of Texas, and SWACHA, Texas' clearinghouse association, the Texas Department of Banking is making online security a priority for 2012. Members of these groups have formed a new Texas Bankers Electronic Crimes Task Force, which has just issued new recommendations to help institutions improve online security and risk management programs - specifically to defend against ACH and wire fraud.

Stanley Tippins Sr. began his law enforcement career in 1988. He has served as Special Agent with the Central Alabama Drug Task Force and the Northeast Alabama Task Force/Anniston Police Department. He is a contract Instructor with The Institute of Criminal Justice Education, and Adjunct Instructor at Central Alabama Community College/Alexander City Alabama.

Tippins recently completed the Instructor Development course, which certifies him to develop instructional courses for law enforcement personnel. Tippins graduated from Faulkner University with a Bachelor of Science degree and Master of Science degree with Specialization in Criminal Justice, and is currently pursuing a PhD in Public Safety with Specializations in Criminal Justice.
