Spear Phishing Becomes Focused Like Never Before

While on the road recently I received an email from Amazon.com confirming my purchase of a 55" Sharp LED flat panel TV. After reading the email on my phone, a moment of panic ensued as I had not purchased any TV from Amazon.

I did not click the embedded "Order #" link, but called Amazon who asked me to read the email and the order number referenced in the email. They immediately informed me that the email was part of a long running spear phishing attack.

I deleted the email, received a couple more over the next two weeks, then they stopped.

While I was well aware of the threat of phishing attacks, I became the target of what has now become a finely tuned criminal network, with more convincing emails than ever used to perpetrate fraud.
