Retailers, Banks, Schools...Crime at Record Levels

Macy's and Target recently revealed that they will be shutting down select stores across the US, citing violence tied to ongoing organized retail theft.

Last week in Philadelphia looters ransacked and destroyed multiple stores over a two day stretch of violence. The crime spree resulted in the temporary closure of state-run liquor stores in the area after several were vandalized and burglarized.

A recent survey of retailers nationwide indicated that losses related to criminal acts in their stores increased by more than \$17 billion dollars, totaling over \$121 billion dollars for one year. An all too old adage "we all pay for it with higher prices" seems like a lament that beckons defeat.

Financial institutions are reporting losses related to check fraud and "card-crackin" at historic levels.

School behavior has escalated from a lack of respect for authority and rules, to schools where criminal acts are not an unusual occurrence. No far from my home a Walgreens store was targeted for a smash and grab by more than 50 students from a nearby high school. Clearly a copycat event from what they see going on in other larger cities, but more significant is that there was no reporting of the event by the media. To the general public, no one knew what happened. I wonder how many more of these events are occurring in your communities?

"Where are the police?" is the first reaction heard from many pundits, some who just a few short months ago criticized everything related to policing. For an example, search "Shivanthi Sathanandan", a Minnesota lawmaker who called for the dismantling of the entire police department, until she was car-jacked and beaten.

While no one would never want this to happen to someone, and I reference the incident only to show the hypocrisy and idiocy of those who call for the dismantling of law enforcement.

But the greater issue of crime in America is not a policing problem. It is a values, morals, and societal issue that is impacting every community, and criminal activity is the symptom.

We have to have norms in society to function, and those norms must be based on a universal understanding that principles of faith and family are the foundation upon which we build a better society.

In the meantime, law enforcement at every level of the criminal justice system is being challenged by a society where there are "no norms". Make sure you are solid in your moral foundation as you are challenged everyday by a world that isn't.
