The Elements of Good Judgment

The daily barrage of news from around the state, nation, and world, bombards us with examples of those who use poor judgment in their careers, or in specific moments in their lives.

Recently I came upon an interesting article in the Harvard Business Review that includes some great information that assists in making better decisions, and examines Leadership and Judgment.

As a warning: It includes the following guidance: "People with good judgment are skeptical of information that doesn't make sense."

As George Orwell once warned us: "We have now sunk to a depth at which restatement of the obvious is the first duty of intelligent men."

The Elements of Good Judgment

- Leaders with good judgment tend to be good listeners and readers.
- Leaders with deep experience in a particular domain may fall into a rut.
- · Leaders need many qualities, but underlying them all is good judgment.

Judgment-the ability to combine personal qualities with relevant knowledge and experience to form opinions and make decisions-is "the core of exemplary leadership," according to Noel Tichy and Warren Bennis (the authors of Judgment: How Winning Leaders Make Great Calls).

Telegram Fraudster Glossary

A great resource for terms used by the fraudsters was compiled by Eric Huber of TD Bank. His Linked In provides background on the spreadsheet he developed:

I have my Telegram fraudster glossary up at fraudsterglossary.com for anyone who wants to use it or contribute to it.

The primary focus of my Telegram research these days has been check deposit fraud and you'll see that reflected in the focus of the list. I'll broaden things out as time goes on.

When I started doing Telegram research, I couldn't find a similar resource so I just started one for my own private use, but I've decided to just share with everyone else now. The "secret sauce" of this glossary is that I have the "Actual Fraudster Usage" column where I show an actual Telegram fraudster is using a term to help provide context.

Basically, this is the glossary that I wish I had when I first started doing Telegram research. It's not exactly the most high tech way of doing it, but the Google sheets option works well and serves my purpose. It also makes it easy for others to download the glossary in a common format.

I went with a pretty broad Creative Commons license option (CC BY-NC-SA 4.0) so that others can take my work and run with it if they want.
