## Traffic Incident Management Course

**Why this is important...** Responders are being struck and killed at traffic incidents in the U.S. on average:

- **5** Firefighters each year
- **1** Law Enforcement Officer each month
- **1** Tow Truck Operator each week

The National TIM Responder Training Program was developed by responders for responders, and was designed to establish the foundation for and promote consistent training of all responders to achieve the three objectives of the TIM National Unified Goal (NUG):

- Responder Safety
- Safe, Quick Clearance
- Prompt, Reliable, Interoperable Communications

**The Target Audience for this course is;**

- **Law Enforcement - Fire/Rescue - Emergency Medical Services (EMS) - Towing/Recovery - Emergency Management - Communications - Highway/Transportation - Anyone Who May Respond to a Traffic Incident.**
